years ago Italo Svevo's La coscienza di Zeno was published. The novel immediately presented itself as a veritable literary 'case' which had a peculiar, articulate and complex reception. La coscienza di Zeno, in fact, initially did not achieve the success its author wished for; it later received its first acknowledgements in France by the critic Benjamin Crémieux and in Italy by Eugenio Montale, who recognised its value in his famous 1925 essay Omaggio a Italo Svevo. However, the novel has gradually become one of the most representative of modernism and its place within the canon of world literature has yet to be fully explored. La coscienza di Zeno was first translated into French by Paul-Henri Michel (1927), then into English, German and Polish, and to date has been translated and retranslated into Albanian, Arabic, Bulgarian, Catalan, Czech, Chinese, Croatian, Danish, Hebrew, Estonian, Finnish, Japanese, Lithuanian, Dutch, Norwegian, Portuguese, Romanian, Russian, Serbian, Slovenian, Spanish, Swedish, Turkish, Ukrainian and Hungarian. La coscienza di Zeno has offered and keeps offering multiple interpretations that have lent themselves to second degree writings in different genres: to mention just a few, Tullio Kezich's theatrical adaptation, the TV script directed by Sandro Bolchi, Francesca Comencini's film and William Kentridge's transpositions. Moreover, the novel has also been treated in scholastic commentaries that throughout time have had a different critical orientation. Many contemporary authors worldwide (for example, Paul Auster, Nathaniel Rich, J. M. Coetzee) have grasped its essence and tried to recreate its peculiar mixture of irony and cynicism, but also its great awareness of writing and literature's nature.

The conference would like to discuss the multiplicity of themes that *La coscienza di Zeno*, even at the second degree, has aroused and keeps arousing and therefore intends to explore the following lines of investigation:

- 1) Second-degree writings for adults and/or young people, screenplays, theatrical, film and television adaptations, artistic transpositions;
- 2) Translations and retranslations into European and non-European languages;
- 3) Reception at scholastic level and in scholarly commentaries;
- 4) Readings, re-readings and reflections a hundred years after the novel's publication.

Proposals for communications on these themes will be considered, though not exclusively.

The conference will be streamed live and attendance will be in blended form; papers may also be presented online on the MS Teams platform.

Researchers are invited to send proposals for contributions in Italian and English by **15** april **2023** to the following address **coscienza.dizeno100@units.it** according to the scheme:
